We wish to report:

1. Ordinance No. 13-19 authorizing and directing the Newark City safety director to certify to the Licking County Auditor, the sum of \$21,598.00 incurred by the Newark City Property Maintenance Department with respect to property maintenance violations to be placed as a lien upon certain parcels of real property situated in the city of Newark, Ohio was considered.

Director Spurgeon- stated that they have a really hard working staff in Property Maintenance; they are working extremely diligently to bring up the properties in the community however that requires a Government subsidy. This legislation will give him the authority to recover the costs.
