There was a meeting of the Service Committee in Council Chambers following the Finance Committee, on Monday, September 24, 2012. These members were present:

We wish to report:

1. Ordinance No 12-34 changing the zoning classification of certain real property, generally described as 363 North 21st Street, City of Newark, Licking County, Ohio from that of single family residence- RL - Low Density District, to LB-Limited Intensity Business District was reviewed.

Law Director- stated that historically these types of ordinances are read at Council, which constitutes the first reading; Council then refers the ordinance to Planning Commission. Planning Commission holds a public hearing and the Commission votes whether to send back to council for another public hearing, which constitutes a second reading.

Motion by Mr. Bubb to send to full Council, second by Ms. Stare
Motion passed with a vote of 5-0.

2. Resolution No 12-79 authorizing and directing the Mayor of the City of Newark, Ohio and the Director of Public Service to enter into a modified agreement with the Licking County Board of Commissioners to allow for the use of certain personal property necessary for use in the Licking County Building Code Department was considered.

Director Rhodes- stated that when the City transferred the Building Code Department to the County the City allowed the department use of six (6) vehicles. This is a modified agreement with the County to start bringing those vehicles back to the City of Newark this year.

Motion by Mr. Bubb, second by Mr. Houdeshell to send to full Council

Director Rhodes- stated that he has spoken to Jack Pryor and he is aware of the agreement and feels the schedule is fair as well as the Commissioners.

Mr. Houdeshell- inquired as to what we were going to use the vehicles for.

Director Rhodes- stated that we are going to check with the City Engineers office, the Water Department to see if there is any use for them. He stated that the vehicles are pick-up trucks and have very high mileage and may end up in the next public auction.

Motion passed by a 5-0 vote.
