AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF A TWELVE (12) FOOT WIDE ALLEY AS SHOWN ON THE PLAT OF WEST MAIN STREET ADDITION, AS RECORDED IN PLAT BOOK 3, PAGE 100 OF THE LICKING COUNTY PLAT RECORDS; SAID ALLEY IS LOCATED NORTH OF WEST MAIN STREET, RUNNING EAST FROM NORTH 23rd STREET.

WHEREAS, Newark City Council received a petition from owners of real estate in the City of Newark praying for the herein described alley vacation; and,

WHEREAS, the Street Committee of the City of Newark met on March 7, 2022, and considered the procedure as outlined in Section 723.06 of The Ohio Revised Code whereby notice of the intention to vacate is not required, and approved the preparation and submittal of this legislation for Council consideration, in accordance with Section 723.06 of The Ohio Revised Code; and,

WHEREAS, this Council finds there is good cause for such vacation and that such vacation will not be detrimental to the general interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING, AND STATE OF OHIO; THAT:

Section 1: The following described alley is hereby vacated, reserving, however, unto the City of Newark, Ohio, its successors and assigns, easements for construction, maintenance, and operation of various utilities, publicly owned and otherwise, to wit:

Situated in the State of Ohio, County of Licking, City of Newark and being a twelve (12) foot wide alley as shown on the Plat of West Main Street Addition, as recorded in Plat Book 3 at Page 100 of the Licking County Plat Records, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the southwest corner of Lot 6 of said West Main Street Addition, said point also being the intersection of the north line of said 12 foot wide alley and the east right-of-way line of North 23rd Street;

Thence east along the south line of said Lot 6 to the southeast corner of said Lot 6, said point also being at the intersection of said alley with an intersecting north-south alley;

Thence south, crossing the subject alley, to the northeast corner of Lot 5 of said West Main Street Addition;

Thence west along the north lines of Lots 5,4 and 3 of said addition to the northwest corner of Lot 3, said point also being on the east right-of-way line of North 23rd Street;

Thence north along the east right-of-way line of North 23rd Street to the Place of Beginning.

This description was written based on information provided in existing plat and tax records, without the benefit of a field survey.

Section 2: The Division of Engineering of the City of Newark is hereby instructed to prepare a vacation plat of said vacated alley and the Clerk of Council is instructed to endorse upon such plat the action of this Council, and to cause such plat to be recorded in the Office of the Recorder of Licking County, Ohio.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall become effective at the earliest time permitted by law after passage by Council and signature of the Mayor.

ORDINANCE NO. 22-12

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN TERRITORY, GENERALLY DESCRIBED AS BEING 0.948 ACRES, MORE OR LESS, LOCATED at 137 NORTH VERNON AVENUE IN NEWTON TOWNSHIP, TO THE CITY OF NEWARK, OHIO.

WHEREAS, a petition for the annexation of certain territory in Newton Township and generally described as being 0.948 acres, more or less, located at 137 North Vernon Avenue in Newton Township, Licking County, Ohio, adjacent and contiguous to the City of Newark, was duly filed with the Board of County Commissioners and approved for annexation to the City of Newark; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has forwarded the transcript of the proceedings in connection with the annexation, certifying that all requirements set forth in Chapter 709 of the Ohio Revised Code have been fulfilled, to the Clerk of Council who received the transcript on January 13, 2022; and

WHEREAS, more than sixty (60) days but less than one hundred twenty (120) days from the date of filing of said transcript with the Clerk of Council have elapsed, and the application must now be considered by full Council;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1: The annexation of that real property as applied for in the petition of Connie J. Klema, Attorney at Law, P.O. Box 991, Pataskala, Ohio 43062, as Agent for the Petitioner, Phillip Warner, of the real estate sought to be annexed, is hereby accepted. The territory is hereby described as follows:

See Exhibit "A" for legal description

SECTION 2: The Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to make three copies containing the petition, the map or plat accompanying the petition, the transcript of the proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners, and the resolutions and ordinances in relation to the annexation along with a certificate as to the correctness thereof. The Clerk shall then forthwith deliver one copy to the County Auditor; one copy to the County Recorder; and the other copy to the Secretary of State. The Clerk shall do all other things required by law.

SECTION 3: The annexation of the above described territory to the City of Newark, Ohio, shall become effective thirty (30) days after the passage of this Ordinance provided that if the Ordinance is subjected to a referendum, the annexation, if approved by the Electors, shall become effective thirty (30) days after such approval. The territory annexed shall have all the rights and privileges and shall be subject to the powers of the City of Newark as are the inhabitants within the original limits of said Municipal Corporation.



AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE POSITION CLASSIFICATION, PAY RANGE AND DEPARTMENT AUTHORIZATION TABLES OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, DIVISION OF WATER AND WASTEWATER, BY CREATING THE CLASSIFICATIONS OF UTILITIES ENGINEER, CONSTRUCTION SERVICES MANAGER AND MAINTENANCE TECHNICIAN/OPERATOR AND ELIMINATING THE POSITIONS OF PROJECT ENGINEER, UTILITY OPERATOR AND SECRETARY 1 WITHIN THE DIVISION AND SETTING THE COMPENSATION THEREFORE, AND ESTABLISHING ALL OTHER POSITIONS WITHIN THE DIVISION.

WHEREAS, the Division of Water and Wastewater has had a cause to review their staffing needs and has determined that alteration is warranted in the organization or structure due to changing environmental and workplace needs; and,

WHEREAS, it is necessary to amend the position authorization and classification/pay range tables to accomplish the foregoing objective; and,

WHEREAS, the overall position authorization for division will not change.

WHEREAS, the Personnel Committee considered this matter on March 7, 2022 and recommended that it be considered by full council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1: The positions of Utilities Engineer, Construction Services Manager and Maintenance Technician/Operator are hereby created.

Section 2: These positions shall be funded by the Wastewater Funds and the Water Funds.

Section 3: The salary of the positions of Utilities Engineer shall be \$105,000 annually, Construction Services Manager shall be \$68,640 annually and the Maintenance Technician/Operator shall be Pay Range 40. These position shall receive all the compensation and benefits set forth in the Statement of Policy for Management and Supervision Exempt Personnel and the AFSCME contract respectively.

Section 4: The position classification/pay range table for the Division of Water and Wastewater will be amended as follows:

WHEREAS, the Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant Act of 1998 was signed as law (Public Law 105-181). The purpose of the Act is to save the lives of law enforcement officers by helping States and local units of government and tribal governments equip their law enforcement officers with armor vests.

WHEREAS, The City of Newark was informed by the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance that it is eligible to receive reimbursement for 50% of the total cost for the purchase of bulletproof vests for law enforcement personnel.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1: The Mayor is authorized to take whatever action is legally available to attain funding in the best interest of the City and its participation in available crime reduction and improvement of public safety funding programs

Section 2: The Mayor is designated as the authorizing official to enter into a reimbursement agreement with the United States Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance, to administer the Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant Program and accept said funds.

Section 3: This Resolution shall become effective upon the earliest date permitted by Article 4.07 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING, AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

- Section 1. In furtherance of the directives established herein, the Mayor is authorized to take whatever action is legally available to attain such funding in the best interest of the City and its participation in available emergency medical training programs.
- Section 2. The Mayor is designated as the authorizing official to enter into an agreement with the Ohio Department of Public Safety, to administer the grant program and accept said funds when they become available.
