AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, ACCEPTING, RATIFYING AND ADOPTING AN EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF NEWARK, OHIO, AND THE FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE LOCAL 127, BLUE AND GOLD UNITS, PROVIDING FOR THE APPLICATION OF ALL TERMS, CONDITIONS, AND BENEFITS OF SAID AGREEMENT, EFFECTIVE UPON EXECUTION THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2027, ABOLISHING THE CURRENT EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT WITH THE EFFECTIVE DATES OF JANUARY 1, 2023 THROUGH DECEMBER 2025, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SAID EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENTS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Newark and the Fraternal Order of Police Local 127, Blue and Gold Units, entered into an Employment Agreement dated January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2025 by way of Ordinance 23-31; and,

WHEREAS, upon re-opening negotiations, the City of Newark, has tentatively reached an agreement concerning economic and non-economic employment facts, with the Fraternal Order of Police Local 127, Blue and Gold Units, which would terminate and replace the current employment agreement upon execution through September 30, 2027; and,

WHEREAS, this Council is charged by Section 731.08 of the Ohio Revised Code, with the ultimate responsibility of fixing, by ordinance or resolution, the respective salaries and compensation of the officers, clerks and employees in each department of the City government; and,

WHEREAS, an emergency is hereby declared to exist in order to preserve the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Newark as it is immediately necessary to establish the policies and terms herein; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1: The Employment Agreement and the Memorandums of Understanding prepared and submitted by the City of Newark and the Fraternal Order of Police Local 127, Blue and Gold Units, setting forth provisions providing for compensation, fringe benefits, working conditions, grievance procedures, and collateral matters concerning personnel of the Fraternal Order of Police Local 127, Blue and Gold Units, is hereby approved, accepted, ratified and adopted.

Section 2: The purpose of the Employment Agreement and the Memorandums of Understanding is to define all relevant terms, specify the class of employees who are affected by the Agreement, set forth certain authorized and unauthorized employment practices, provide for rates of compensation

for the class of employees specified, guarantee certain fringe benefits, set forth various grievance procedures, and otherwise provide for all related personnel employment matters which constitute the complete and entire Agreement relating to the employer/employee relationship between the City of Newark and the employees of the Fraternal Order of Police Local 127, Blue and Gold Units.

- Section 3: A complete copy of the Employment Agreement and the Memorandums of Understanding shall be kept on file with the Clerk of Council for inspection by the public. Copies shall be made available for distribution to the public at cost.
- Section 4: With the exception of the matters identified in the Memorandums of Understanding which specifically provide dates of termination and/or adoption for particular terms of the contract, the benefit and wage provisions and all other provisions of the Employment Agreement are effective upon execution through September 30, 2027.
- Section 5: All ordinances, resolutions, sections of the Codified Ordinances, or parts thereof which are inconsistent with any provision within the subject Employment Agreement are hereby repealed. Matters not specifically repealed hereby, to include matters of custom and practice, which are not directly treated or otherwise dealt with by the Employment Agreement, shall be interpreted, construed, and applied in such a way as to render the interpretation, construction, and application as consistent with the purpose and intent of the Employment Agreement as is possible.
- Section 6: WHEREAS, an emergency is hereby declared to exist in order to preserve the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Newark as it is immediately necessary to establish the policies and terms herein Therefore, this legislation shall become effective immediately upon passage in accordance with Article 4.06 of the City Charter.

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AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY, GENERALLY DESCRIBED AS 278 SOUTH 24^{TH} STREET, CITY OF NEWARK, LICKING COUNTY, OHIO, PARCEL TAX ID #054-223428-00.000 FROM THAT OF SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENCE – RH-HIGH DENSITY ZONING DISTRICT TO TFR – TWO-FAMILY RESIDENCE DISTRICT, ZONING CODE OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, OHIO.

WHEREAS, an application for zoning classification has been filed with Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 4.12 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio, this ordinance shall be referred to the Planning Commission immediately after its first reading; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission shall hold a public hearing upon such application and the Clerk of Council shall cause notice of such hearing to be publicized one time at least seven (7) days prior to the date of such public hearing; and

WHEREAS, upon the return of the ordinance to Council by the Planning Commission, council shall cause a second reading to be made of this ordinance and shall take such action as is appropriate pursuant to Article 4.12 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING, AND STATE OF OHIO, THAT:

Section 1: The zoning map as established by Ordinance 08-33 (A) is hereby revised by changing the zoning classification for the following described property from SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENCE – RH – HIGH DENSITY ZONING DISTRICT TO TFR – TWO-FAMILY RESIDENCE DISTRICT, Zoning Code of the City of Newark.

SEE EXHIBIT "A" FOR LEGAL DESCRIPTION

Section 2: Pursuant to Article 4.12(C) of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio, a vote of at least six (6) members shall be necessary to adopt or defeat the ordinance in the event the Planning Commission has recommended approval or has made no recommendation. An affirmative vote of at least seven (7) Council members shall be necessary to adopt a zoning ordinance that the Planning Commission has recommended against approval.

Section 3: The Newark Planning Commission is hereby authorized and directed to make the change described herein on the aforementioned zoning map.

Section 4: This ordinance shall become effective at the earliest time permitted by Section 4.07 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio.

WHEREAS, the Newark City Council passed the Zoning Code of the City of Newark by way of Ordinance 08-33, on May 4, 2009; and,

WHEREAS, the Newark City Division of Zoning caused to be sent a notice addressed to the individuals or entities identified in Exhibit "A" attached hereto with respect to certain property in the City of Newark, directing such individuals or entities to correct violations within a proscribed period of time; and,

WHEREAS, upon failure of the individuals or entities identified in Exhibit "A" to abate violations, the Newark City Service Director and/or his agent, authorized employees, agents and contractors to access the non-complaint properties and correct the conditions, thereby expending funds for such violation abatement; and,

WHEREAS, the Zoning Code authorizes the Newark City Service Director to assess against a property any costs incurred to bring the property into compliance, including, but are not limited to, any costs incurred due to the use of employees, materials or equipment of Newark, arising out of contracts for labor, materials, or equipment, costs of services of notice(s), filing of affidavit, title searches, or any other necessary costs.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING AND STATE OF OHIO, AS SET FORTH BELOW:

Section One. WHEREAS, the Newark City Council passed the City of Newark's Property Maintenance Code on the 17th day of January, 2007 and an amendment on the 17th day of June, 2008.

WHEREAS, the Newark City Property Maintenance Department caused to be sent a notice addressed to the individuals or entities identified in Exhibit "A" attached hereto with respect to certain property in City of Newark, directing such individuals or entities to correct violations within a proscribed period of time; and,

WHEREAS, upon failure of the individuals or entities identified in Exhibit "A" to abate violations, Property Maintenance Code Ord. 07-03 authorizes the Newark City Safety Director, his/her authorized employees, agents and contractors to access real property upon which weeds were permitted to grow, structures were unsecured and the accumulation of rubbish existed and correct the conditions existing thereon, thereby expending funds for such violation abatement; and,

WHEREAS, Property Maintenance Code authorizes the Newark City Safety Director to assess against a property any costs incurred to bring the property into compliance, including, but are not limited to, any costs incurred due to the use of employees, materials or equipment of Newark, arising out of contracts for labor, materials, or equipment, costs of services of notice(s), filing of affidavit, title searches, or any other necessary costs.

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio, by and through the Director of Development has determined that effective August 16, 1988 the City of Newark exhibits the characteristics set for in ORC section 5709.61 to qualify as an Enterprise Zone and did certify the City of Newark as an Enterprise Zone under ORC Section 5709.63; and,

WHEREAS, Enterprise Zone Abatement Agreements are negotiated between the applicant and the Board of County Commissioners though the agreement must be approved by this Council before the agreement can be approved by the Board of County Commissioners; and,

WHEREAS, Packaging Corporation of America has submitted an updated Project Intake form, dated September 17, 2024 (Exhibit "A"), to be used to amend the existing Enterprise Zone Abatement Agreement data, in the manner prescribed by the Director of Development of the State of Ohio setting forth a plan to establish and occupy a facility in the City of Newark Enterprise Zone and to preserve employment opportunities for existing employees within such Zone and has requested that it be granted one or more of the tax abatement incentives set forth in ORC section 5709.62 in exchange for implementation of the proposed plan; and,

WHEREAS, the amended Project Intake form, submitted by Packaging Corporation of America includes the intention to retain all existing 131 full-time permanent hourly and salaried employees and to retain an existing payroll base of \$9,150,000.00; and,

WHEREAS, the amended Project Intake form-submitted by Packaging Corporation of America includes a plan to establish, expand, renovate, and/or occupy a facility with **total New Project Investment of approximately \$229,000,000.00** for the acquisition of buildings and land, additional and new construction, machinery, fixture, equipment, and furniture along with improvements to existing buildings and land; and,

WHEREAS, the investment intended to be made by Packaging Corporation of America pursuant to the amended Proposed Enterprise Zone Abatement Agreement represents a significant and eligible investment within the City of Newark, Ohio pursuant to ORC section 5709.63: and,

WHEREAS, Packaging Corporation of America had previously submitted a Proposed Enterprise Zone Abatement Agreement which was consented to by this Council on August 18, 2020, with the adoption of Resolution 20-55 which is to be repealed and replaced by the instant Resolution for the reasons as stated herein; and,

WHEREAS, economic circumstances have improved since the CoVid-19 pandemic and quarantine and have now become favorable, which has caused Packaging Corporation of America to re-consider the scope of the intended project and to submit an updated Project Intake form, to be used to amend the existing Enterprise Zone Abatement Agreement in light of such changed circumstances; and,

WHEREAS, Packaging Corporation of America appears to be qualified by financial responsibility and business experience to create and preserve employment opportunities within the Enterprise Zone and to improve the economic climate within the City of Newark, Ohio; and,

WHEREAS, the project site as proposed herein is located within the Newark City and C-TEC School Districts and the Board of Education for both districts has been notified of and provided a copy of the proposed agreement pursuant to ORC section 5709.83; and,
