We wish to report :

1. Ordinance No. 22-04 TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$1,125,000 OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE COST OF CHURCH STREET AREA IMPROVEMENTS AND REPAIR, INCLUDING ELECTRICAL, SIDEWALK, STREET AND STREETSCAPE, AND ALL NECESSARY APPURTENANCES THERETO, AND DECALRING AN EMERGENCY

Ryan Bubb, City Auditor – If you would like I will speak to 22-04 through 22-06. These are bond anticipation notes that are being renewed at the same amount they were a year ago. The reason for the emergency clause, time is of the essence, these have to be approved by March 23rd. If you would like more details on the project I would ask you to refer to Mr. Morehead, this actually one of his projects. If you are interested, interest rate is between 1.65% and 1.75% this could change but that is what it is as of today.

Director Rhodes – We are asking for an appropriation from the ARP Fund for \$60,000 so the City can build and update our website.

Motion to send to full council by Mr. Barker, second by Mr. Lang

Mr. Lang – Director Rhodes, could you just go into a little bit more detail about the timeline and what we are looking to accomplish?

Director Rhodes – Well. To jump to the last part of your question, we're looking to have an updated website that is more interactive to where people can say get a zoning permit online, pay for it online, pay your taxes online, if you get a ticket for a stop sign or speeding, pay it online, things of that nature. You also have to remember, a couple years back we went through a rebranding of the City and that's where this idea of the webpage grew out of, a couple years later now, we have an avenue to pay for it and we thought it was a good use of funds. So, to rebrand the City and make the webpage updated and current.

Mr. Lang – So, it sounds like we'll be looking for ways to make it more self -service and then also the branding, what's the overall timeline?

Director Rhodes – We don't have that in place yet, we wanted to get the funds in place and then get a contract in place, we can't sign a contract until we have the funds in place. Then at that time, any council member who wants to sit in on this is more than welcome, we'll let you know, make you aware and you're certainly more than welcome to sit in and give your input. When we launch it, we want it to be right and I don't anticipate this being a quick process, but it's not a process that is going to drag on for years, it's a process we're going to get done. Mr. Marmie – Director Rhodes and I spoke today last minute, so this didn't get emailed to anybody but this is kind of what we're talking about here. I haven't even had a chance to look this over yet, but he said he would give us details as far as what we're looking at. The other thing, just to bring some of you up on a little bit of history, there was supposed to have been a big major overhaul in design, previously, Kim Burton, that really didn't take place so this is long overdue and I think it will definitely add to everything that we are doing, not only in Newark, but in Licking County. We are the center of this County and we're the hub and we need to make sure that folks who are going to be coming our way with all the development that they've recently announced and also, all that we've done for the downtown area and making our community a community of choice, this is just another thing that we need to polish up a little bit, make it better, make it more user friendly and it will also at the same time make us more efficient. That's the key to it. If you can order your permits and do things like that online versus having to go up and wait in line and wait on customer service, that is definitely going to be more beneficial.

Ms Hottinger – Question. The Maintenance agreement that will go with that I assume, is that something you will come to us later for, or do you already have that in your budget?

Director Rhodes – The ongoing maintenance agreement is something that I will come to you with in the future. When I get my hands around what that will be. That is something I will definitely be back with you on. We need to do a better job of telling our story. We don't do a good job with that. Website and maybe a little more social media.

Mr. Barker – I would just add that this is a part of our vision plan so we are checking another box on the vision plan for Newark with this and so it's something prior to my role as a Councilman that I was very involved in and I'm glad it's moving forward to day.

Mr. Marmie – One final thing, just so you know where we are. Our General Fund unappropriated balance is \$533,177.01 and the rainy day balance is \$1, 044,236. 97.
