Project Title: 16 North Sewer Separation Project

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, OHIO TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT AND ENTER INTO A WATER POLLUTION CONTROL LOAN FUND AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF NEWARK FOR PLANNING, DESIGN AND/OR CONSTRUCTION OF WASTEWATER FACILITIES (16 NORTH SEPARATION PROJECT) AND DESIGNATING A DEDICATED REPAYMENT SOURCE FOR THE LOAN.

Background/Purpose:

As part of the City's Long-Term Control Plan (LTCP), it is required by OEPA to continue implementation of Combined Sewer separation for Phase 2, Area #3 (16 North). The project area consists of sewers along Mt. Vernon Road (north of St. Rt. 16 to Rugg Ave.), Hudson Avenue, Rugg Avenue, Jefferson Road, Fairfield Avenue. Refer to Figure 1 for the project area.

Scope of Work:

The Division of Water and Wastewater, through the Director of Public Service, is requesting authorization to enter into a Design agreement for this project. This work will include review of the Preliminary Design Report and development of detailed design plans of the sanitary and storm sewer separations, water line replacements and supplementary roadway remediation. Construction bid documents will also be developed.

Justification/Urgency:

The Combined Sewer Separation project for Phase 2, Area #3 is required to be completed by July 1, 2028. It is anticipated that detailed design will take 12-18 months with construction bidding anticipated in late 2024 or early 2025. It is in the best interest of the City to continue the design of this project to ensure required milestones are met.

Anticipated Costs and funding source:

The estimated design cost at this time is \$4M. The project has been nominated for funding to Ohio EPA Water Pollution Control Loan Fund.

Schedule or Term of Contract:

After the Preliminary Design Report (PDR) is completed in 4th quarter 2022, the Detailed Design is expected to start 1st Quarter 2023 with anticipated construction starting 4th quarter 2024.

Current Contract(s):

The Preliminary Design Report is expected to be completed in 4th quarter 2022 by Hazen and Sawyer.

Governance:


Current legislation is needed to enter into a design agreement.

Infrastructure Sustainability:

The existing Combined Sewers in the project area will be separated to provide increased capacity of the sanitary sewer and wastewater plant and reduced volume of combined sewage will be entering the waterways in the City. Additionally, a portion of aged water lines will likely be replaced as part of the work.

Community Impact:

This project will benefit the City with separate sanitary and storm sewers and will also provide improved road and right of way beautification as part of the project.
