A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE EXECUTION OF A FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE PATASKALA CORPORATE PARK JOINT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT CONTRACT WITH THE CITY OF PATASKALA AND THE TOWNSHIP OF HARRISON.

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 715.70 – R.C. 715.72, by ordinance 09-74, the City of Newark, Harrison Township and the City of Pataskala executed a Joint Economic Development District Contract on December 22, 2009 creating the Pataskala Corporate Park Joint Economic Development District (the "JEDD"). The JEDD currently encompasses the area depicted in Exhibit E, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Original JEDD Contract, the Board of Directors for the JEDD imposed a 1.75% tax on income from employees working within the Original JEDD Area and on net business profits in the Original JEDD Area; and,

WHEREAS, Pataskala Logistics Land, LLC (the "Developer") desires to develop a parcel of land for industrial purposes (the "Project" or "Project Area") at a site within the boundaries of the City of Pataskala (the "JEDD Addition") which is further described on the attached Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference, provided the appropriate economic development incentives are available to support the economic viability of the Project. The JEDD Addition is located outside of the Original JEDD Area as depicted in Exhibit F. The Original JEDD Area and the JEDD Addition are referred to collectively here as the "Expanded JEDD Area". The Expanded JEDD Area is depicted on Exhibit A hereto and incorporated herein by this reference; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 715.761, the contracting parties of the JEDD may amend the contract from time to time to add to the JEDD District any area that was not originally included in the District when the contract became effective; and,

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Newark, along with the City of Pataskala and the Township of Harrison, want to add the JEDD Addition to the Original JEDD Area by executing a First Amendment to the Pataskala Corporate Park Joint Economic Development Contract (the "First Amendment to JEDD Contract"), substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, Council for the City of Newark desires to enter into the First Amendment to JEDD Contract for the purpose of facilitating economic development to create jobs and employment opportunities and to improve the economic welfare of the people in the City of Newark, the Township of Harrison, and the City of Pataskala, Licking County (the "County"), and the State

of Ohio (the "State") and anticipates that adding the JEDD Addition to the Original JEDD Area will bring economic development, jobs and revenue to the City, the Township, the County and the State; and

WHEREAS, the JEDD Addition meets all the criteria set forth in the JEDD Statute; and

WHEREAS, Council for the City of Newark has authority to enter into the First Amendment to JEDD Contract pursuant to the JEDD Statute; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 715.72(L)(2), Council for the City of Newark has made available for public inspection a copy of the First Amendment to JEDD Contract, a description of the area to be added to the Original JEDD Area, and a map of the area to be added to the Original JEDD Area, and a map of the area to be added to the Original JEDD Area, and a map of the area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 715.729(I)(1), Council for the City of Newark has published a notice of public hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the City, a certification from the City that the public hearing was held, the date of the hearing, and evidence of publication of the notice of the hearing is attached hereto as Exhibit D; and

WHEREAS, the Developer, as the only owner of the JEDD Addition, filed property owner and business owner petitions pursuant to R.C. 715.72(L)(3), thus alleviating the need for the City to give notice as would otherwise have been required under R.C. 715.72(J); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. 715.72(L)(2), Council for the City of Newark has held a public hearing allowing for public comment and recommendation on the First Amendment to JEDD Contract and the JEDD; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEWARK, COUNTY OF LICKING, STATE OF OHIO, A MAJORITY OF MEMBERS PRESENT CONCURRING THAT:

<u>Section 1:</u> Council for the City of Newark hereby finds and determines the terms of the First Amendment to JEDD Contract are in the best interests of the City and its residents and will enhance economic development, create jobs and employment opportunities, and improve the economic welfare of the people of the City, the Township, the City of Newark, the County, and the State.

<u>Section 2:</u> Council for the City of Newark hereby approves the First Amendment to JEDD Contract, freely and without duress or coercion, and authorizes the Mayor to execute the First Amended JEDD Contract, substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B, with such non-material and/or non-adverse changes as may be deemed appropriate by the Mayor, on behalf of the City. Such execution on behalf of the City shall constitute conclusive evidence of the City Council's approval of such changes. Council for the City of Newark further authorizes and directs the Mayor to take any further actions, and to execute and deliver additional agreements, certificates or documents which are necessary, reasonable and/or appropriate to carry out the purposes of the First Amended JEDD Contract.

<u>Section 3</u>: Council for the City of Newark hereby authorizes and directs the Mayor to file with the Director of the Ohio Development of Development, in conjunction with the City of Pataskala, and the Township of Harrison, all documents required to be filed under R.C. 715.72(O), including without limitation, (i) a signed copy of the First Amendment to JEDD Contract, (ii) a description of the area to be added to the Original JEDD Area, including a map in sufficient detail to denote the specific boundaries of the area, (iii) a certified copy of this Resolution, (iv) a certification from the City of Newark that the public hearing required by R.C. 715.72(L)(2) was held, the date of the hearing, and evidence of publication of the notice of the hearing, and (v) the petition signed by the Authority as the only owner of the JEDD Addition.

<u>Section 4</u>: The City of Newark hereby consents, pursuant to R.C. 715.72(U), to the granting of tax exemptions in the Expanded JEDD Area, including but not limited to exemptions under R.C. 3735.67, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the JEDD Agreement.

<u>Section 5</u>: It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of Council and that all deliberations of the Council and any of the decision-making bodies of the City of Newark which resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements of the State of Ohio.

<u>Section 6:</u> This Resolution shall become effective upon the earliest date permitted by Article 4.07 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio.

WHEREAS, an application for zoning classification has been filed with Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 4.12 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio, this ordinance shall be referred to the Planning Commission immediately after its first reading; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission shall hold a public hearing upon such application and the Clerk of Council shall cause notice of such hearing to be publicized one time at least seven (7) days prior to the date of such public hearing; and

WHEREAS, upon the return of the ordinance to Council by the Planning Commission, council shall cause a second reading to be made of this ordinance and shall take such action as is appropriate pursuant to Article 4.12 of the Charter of the City of Newark, Ohio.

LIC-SR79-13.30 – PID 110414 project, which is the maintenance and rehabilitation of 22 bridge structures along State Route16 and 79 within the City of Newark, to be constructed in 2023.

LIC-SR16/79 – 20.27/12.46 – PID 97858 project, which is the resurfacing of State Route 79, north of West Main Street, to State Route 16, continuing east to Dayton Road, including all associated ramps, to be constructed in 2024.

SECTION II – Cooperation Statement

The LPA shall cooperate with the Director of Transportation in the development and construction of the above described project as follows:

- 1. The LPA gives consent for the above improvement, and
- 2. The LPA further agrees to pay 100% of the cost of those features requested by the LPA which are determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration to by unnecessary for the Project.

SECTION IV - Utilities and Right-of-Way Statement

If village owned utilities, within a corporation limit or in a private easement outside corporation limits, need to be relocated due to this ODOT project, the village will be reimbursed for any relocation work; ODOT will perform the coordination, relocation, and reimbursement which shall comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual.

If other public and private utilities need to be relocated due to this ODOT project they will not be reimbursed for relocation; with exceptions due to an easement, etc.

SECTION V – Maintenance

Upon completion of the Project, and unless otherwise agreed, the LPA shall: (1) provide adequate maintenance for the Project in accordance with all applicable State and Federal law, including, but not limited to, Title 23, U.S.C., Section 116; (2) provide ample financial provisions, as necessary, for the maintenance of the Project; (3) maintain the right-of-way, keeping it free of obstructions; and (4) hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes.

SECTION VI Authority to Sign

The LPA hereby authorizes, _______ of the <u>City of Newark</u> is hereby empowered on behalf of the <u>City of Newark</u> to enter into agreements with the Director of Transportation which are necessary to complete the above described project.

SECTION VII-Emergency measure

If required, Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure to expedite the highway project and to promote highway safety. Following appropriate legislative action, as an emergency measure, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
